PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Impacting Student Life

"We want projects that directly impact the daily lives of students at Kingsway College." This is the philosophy that Greg Bussey uses as he brings projects to administration each year for us to consider. An alumnus of Kingsway College himself, he understands the personal connection and affinity people have with this institution. Part of this relathey had here as students.

Over the past four summers, Greg has put his philosophy into practice as he has spearheaded projects aimed at improving our campus while positively enhancing our students' experience while they attend Kingsway College. Not only has he lead out in the capital campaigns raising the funds for these projects, but he has also personally overseen, and participated in, the construction involved in each one.

While Greg has been the catalyst for these changes, it is you, our alumni donors, that have been the support allowing these projects to go forward. This September, students were blessed as they returned to a newly renovated cafeteria dining area. How did that happen? Well, there is a story of generosity that you need to hear.

This past year Greg discussed with school administration the various projects that we could embark on and we settled on the cafeteria renovation. This was envisioned as a three-phase approach where we would renovate the dining area, the serving area, and the kitchen itself, over the next few years as funds became available. The dream was

that this year we would be able to redo the dining area to start, refinishing the floor, having new tables and chairs, redoing the ceiling and lighting, and updating the boys' washroom in the foyer of the Cafeteria. All of this had a price tag of around \$120,000 making it an ambitious project.

tionship stems from the positive experience Greg launched the capital campaign as he visited with our different alumni chapters and contacting potential donors. Our alumni responded wonderfully, and by the beginning of the summer, there was \$80,000 in hand to start the renovations. Recognizing we did not have enough funds to do all that was planned, Greg moved forward with the project figuring we would do what we could with what we had, namely the refinishing of the floor, painting, LED lighting and the replacement of the dining room chairs. Although short of what we wanted to do, it would still be a great improvement.

> A couple of weeks into the project, Greg excitedly called me into his office and said: "We are redoing the complete t-bar ceiling!" In response to my query as to what had changed, he told me about a new donation to the project. An alumnus had dropped by the school and he was showing them the work being done in the Cafeteria, explaining what we were able to do with the finances we had, and what else we would like to do. This former student embraced the project saying, "I will pay for the refurbishing of

that Greg received a bittersweet phone call from the son of a former teacher at Kingsway College. His father had recently passed and in the former teacher's will there was a financial gift to our school. The son called because the family wanted to know if they could have some input as to how these funds would be used. Greg suggested a split between the Worthy Student Fund and the Cafeteria project as two possibilities. It was with tears that the son told Greg, "My Dad would be happy to know that he was able to be part of this." It was that donation that made it possible to purchase the new tables, completing the first phase of the project as envisioned.

I just want to express a BIG thank you to all of those who gave so we were able to complete this project. We want students to enjoy their experience here at Kingsway College, just as you did when you were a student here. By providing enjoyable spaces for our students to socialize in like the renovated dorm lobbies, and now the Cafeteria, you are enhancing student life here on this campus. Thank you for your care and interest in this school as we continue "To reflect Jesus Christ, and prepare students for His service."


TWENTY NINETEEN CONING

























ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR

JOE WESTSTRATE 1929-2019

Johannes (Joe) Weststrate immigrated in 1954 from the Netherlands to begin a new life in Canada. He and his wife Mary, began their new lives in Calgary, Alberta. After working there for several years, he received a call in 1963 from Percy Manuel, President of Kingsway College and was asked to move to Oshawa, Ontario to be the General Manager for College Woodwork. He worked for College Woodwork for 32 years and retired "officially" from College Woodwork in 1995; however, he stayed on as a purchasing and inventory agent until 2015.

While being the General Manager at College Woodwork, he was active in volunteering at the College Park Church. He was on the church board, finance committee as well as the head elder for many years. He was the treasurer for College Park Elementary school beginning in 1972 and stayed in this position until 2015.

Joe served on the Kingsway College board and finance committee for the years that followed his retirement from College Woodwork. He was a strong supporter of Christian Education and the Seventh-day Adventist Church throughout his life. He always made time for his family and has been a man of faith and a true example of Christianity in action.

Joe Weststrate passed away at home on July 6, 2019. He would've been 90 years of age on July 30, 2019.




WARD HILL

Ward Hill spent around 25 years in Canada as a pastor in Montreal, Ottawa, St. John's, and Toronto (at Willowdale Church). When he was at Willowdale, he also started teaching religion to the nursing students at North York Branson Hospital. When he was at Willowdale, Kingsway College asked him to teach in the religion department there. He taught for 5 years.

At the same time he was working on his Ph.D at York University and the University of Toronto. In 1971, he was called to Union College where he was eventually became a Professor, then Head of the Humanities Division and eventually Vice-President for Academic Affairs. He retired around 1996 but continued to teach classes after that. He developed dementia around 2007. Ward Hill passed away on April 20, 2017, at 88 years old.





VIOLET PROUTY 1921-2019



Violet Lillian Curtis was born in St. John's, Newfoundland, on July 12, 1921. She was the third of four children, with older brothers Arch and Roy, and younger sister, Winnie (Walter Fedusenko). Violet's father was a sailor, working as a first mate on various ships of the Black Diamond line. Her mother had worked as a seamstress until her marriage.

When Violet was 8, her family became Seventh-day Adventists, and the children attended the SDA school on Freshwater Road. Violet loved school. When she finished high school at 16, she enrolled in Normal School at Memorial University and was a qualified teacher by 17.

She taught at the SDA schools in Corner Brook and St. John's. In 1940, however, the St. John's school had a teacher surplus. To solve the problem, she was offered the paid opportunity to go to Oshawa Missionary College (now Kingsway College) for a year. She happily accepted this offer since her brothers Arch and Roy were already there.

On the afternoon she arrived, her brothers had other plans, so Roy drafted his friend, Stewart Prouty, to show Violet around campus. Thus began a friendship that matured into a romance. Stewart and Violet were married on July 25, 1948. Their first home was an apartment in the basement of the old Administration Building, where Stewart built her a periscope so she could see out the windows! It was the beginning of 58 happy years together.

By then, Violet had been teaching at the elementary school for several years. Soon, however, their first child was on the way and she stopped teaching at Easter in 1949. Janet was born on her mother's birthday that year. Also that year, they began building their first house on Lawson Road. Don arrived in 1950, Bob in 1951 and Joy in 1952. The family seemed complete, but five years later Will arrived, followed by Joan in 1960 and Jean in 1961. The first grandchild, Alex, arrived in 1974 in Loma Linda, California, and the grandkids arrived in spates thereafter. All told, she had 27 grandchildren. And then the grandchildren started having children. At her death, Violet had 41 great-grandchildren,

all of whom knew her as Gigi (for Great Grandma).

When her youngest child, Jean, was almost six, Violet returned to teaching in September 1967. She taught first and/or second grade from 1967 to 1984, and her nieces and daughters were trained to call her Mrs. Prouty while they were her students. She introduced hundreds of children to the wonders of reading and math, and it was a rare student who frustrated her attempts. Even in retirement, she could never quite get out of teaching mode. As a volunteer at the elementary school, she helped students learn to read and told children's stories for many years. The old elementary school was re-named V. Prouty Hall in her honour. She received the Alumnus of the Year Award from Kingsway College in 1986.

Violet was fun. She loved jokes, but it was a running family gag that she couldn't tell one: she always blew the punch line. She loved to play games: Lost Heir, Scrabble, Boggle, Rage and Backgammon were favourites, and it didn't take much persuasion to engage her. She was patient with beginners—her grandchildren and great-grandchildren—and assisted where required, but she was too competitive to let anyone win just because losing might hurt their feelings!

By objective standards, Violet's was an ordinary life. It was long and well-lived but not remarkable. But for those of us who knew and loved her, her life was one of extraordinary influence. She taught us to love unconditionally. She taught us





to be tolerant. She taught us to be curious. She taught us the value of fun and fellowship. She modeled marriage as an equal partnership. With her brother, Roy, she modeled a sibling relationship that was loving and close for over 90 years. To her family and students, Violet was remarkable, and we will miss her.
